TCPM Chair's Report 01/17/2022

As 2021 fades into the distance, Twin Cities Prison Ministry can look back on a year filled with challenges but also filled with opportunities. In our second year of isolation from those we serve, TCPM was able to continue to live out its mission through the Angel Tree program, *fish*, Ignatian Meditation's, and the Pen Pal Program. Where other organizations waited for institutions to reopen, TCPM found ways to expand Christ's call despite restrictions. And many were helped as a result.

2021 also saw the completion of new organization programs at TCPM. Over the course of the year, our Operation's Committee completed instillation of Salesforce CRM software and now has an excellent data base containing hundreds of contacts from which to draw donors, future committee members, and expand its outreach for additional growth.

Our Communication's Committee has engaged with Catch-a-Fire consultants and launched an enhanced website providing for a greater social media presence and a stronger platform for delivery of our message and mission.

And our Finance Committee has completed implementation a data base to provide a state-of-the-art finance management system capable of tracking income and expenses and reporting to funders the fiscally responsible use of their money to support those we serve.

Though 2022 is only days old, many challenges from the last several years persist. Society remains divided on countless issues not the least of which concern racial inequalities and unjust treatment of many that directly impacts those we serve. And it appears that the isolation of our brothers and sisters behind bars will continue for the foreseeable future. But our mission persists, and we must redouble our efforts to serve those in need to an even greater extend that we did last year. And that will require more workers. More committee members. More volunteers. In 2022 TCPM will need to exploit its new systems to contact and educate more individuals on the issues surrounding incarceration, to provide more ways in which individuals can engage with those we serve and seek out more to "visit the prisoner". Our brothers and sisters require us to do nothing less. Christ calls us to do nothing less.
