





Overcoming the deadly effects of a violent and absent father, he is passionate about changing the urban cycles of recidivism, poverty and patterns of choice by modeling, both in behavior and education, how to rebuild relationships and creating pathways to success. Since transforming his life in 1994, John is a community leader, pastor, speaker, facilitator and has authored and co-authored curriculum on parenting. His business work history includes management, program coordination, youth counselor and broadcasting in radio and TV. Received television Emmy award has written his life story called Bloodline.



Rob Maho I am a Christian Native, husband, grandfather, TC Habitat for Humanity employee (Carpenter / home builder), and missionary. For over 15 years I've been going into MCF Lino Lakes with a team monthly to provide Sunday services. I also am on the Board of Directors with REC (Residents Encounter Christ,) that puts on annual retreats in 3 different prisons as well as monthly follow-up meetings in each of those prisons. I have served in many areas of outreach, such as Sunday School at an inner city projects, Street Level Evangelism and the Salvation Army Adult Rehabilitation Center My wife and I have led Bible Studies and fellowship gatherings in our home.

Marlin Meszaros is a person living in long-term recovery from SUD. He credits his recovery to his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. During his years of struggle, he served over 10 years of time in various Minnesota Correctional Facilities. Today he celebrates over 8 years of living in recovery and is the Program Manager for a large reentry and recovery ministry in North Minneapolis. One of his many interests is criminal justice reform and advocacy.



Paul Schnell was appointed commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Corrections (DOC) by Governor Tim Walz on January 7, 2019. Commissioner Schnell brings more than 30 years of public safety and corrections experience to his new position with the DOC. His wealth of knowledge in these fields is a great asset to the DOC. While completing his Bachelor of Social Work degree at the University of St. Thomas, Schnell began an internship supervising adult male offenders in a St. Paul halfway house. This internship led to a 10-year stretch of work in a variety of community-based correctional programs in the Twin Cities. In 1993, Schnell moved from his position working with youth offenders at Carver County Court Services to deputy sheriff for the Carver County Sheriff's Office. In 1999, Schnell joined the Saint Paul Police Department where he served in a variety of assignments, including four years as the dept's spokesman. He has served as Chief of Police for the cities of Hastings, Maplewood and Inver Grove Heights Long interested in effective intervention and prevention practices, Schnell became an adjunct faculty member at the University of Saint Thomas and Metropolitan State University, teaching courses in criminal justice diversity, criminal justice ethics, restorative justice, and victimology. In addition to a Bachelor of Social Work degree from the University of St. Thomas, Commissioner Schnell holds a Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership from St. Catherine University in St. Paul.

Mary Jo Robinson-Jamison - is a retired music therapist who began work in that field in the era of giant state hospitals and ended her career at a Bridge View school in St. Paul, a special education facility after 42 years. Her students were challenged by complex combinations of developmental, neurological, social, and emotional issues. She hopes to be of service in any way she can to those affected by incarcerated.

Kari Hanson - Farm girl from south central MN. I endured some difficult trauma during my adolescent years. Have struggled with food addiction, codependency, depression, anxiety, drug/alcohol addiction and in 2009 ended up in prison. It was there that I found God and my life began changing. I am still a work in progress, but God has opened so many doors and I am so grateful for each day that I have.



Tricia Severson - I come from two different families with severe mental health and substance abuse disorders. Abandoned and rejected by both, I entered adulthood at a young age and was swept up into a life of crime, addiction, and the system. I had no one to show me the way and I was broken from the abuse I suffered as a child. I was afraid of God and afraid of everyone. I spent my young adulthood being mistreated at the hands of men and medicating the pain with drugs. Probation was my family and jails and treatments and psychiatric hospitals were my residence. I had children. Some were taken., and some I had to give away. Several times I tried to end my life, but God intervened. He heard me the times I cried out to him. Just like in the days of old...I would look to the Heavens in my darkest hour and cry out to God with my heart breaking...and He heard me. He sent my friend, Karen Troyer, and he sent my friends at Charis, and he sent messengers of hope from all around. With support, and hope, I was able to get sober, get a job, mend the relationships with my kids, and build my rental credit. As I watched God provide for me through people and opportunities, my heart began to melt. The fiery, angry punisher of my childhood was no more. I began to search for a closer relationship with my father through his word. Scripture has taught me that He makes old things new. Today, my past does not haunt me. I am grateful for all the opportunities that grace was demonstrated, and forgiveness taught. I have learned many lessons. My life is tough, and beautiful, and raw and awesome. I have a choice today, and I want to do good. That's different!



Timothy Cameron - an EX-CON for CHRIST (Prodigal Son Returned Home) and sinner saved by Grace. Like The 10th Leper falling at Christ's feet, he authored "The Little Book of Miracles, Stories from the Incomplete Skeptic." Timothy will share a story of incredible forgiveness, and how we can all give hope to the hopeless through forgiveness.

Sister Helen Prejean is known around the world for her tireless work against the death penalty. She has been instrumental in sparking national dialogue on capital punishment and in shaping the Catholic Church's vigorous opposition to all executions. Born in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in the 1930s, Sister Helen grew up in the segregated Jim Crow South. At the age of 18 she joined the Sisters of St. Joseph. She worked as a high school teacher and religious education director in New Orleans before moving into the St. Thomas Housing Project in the early '80s. In 1982, Sister Helen began corresponding with Patrick Sonnier, who had been sentenced to death for the murder of two teenagers. Two years later, when Patrick Sonnier was put to death in the electric chair, Sister Helen was there to witness his execution. In the following months, she became



spiritual advisor to another death row inmate, Robert Lee Willie, who was to meet the same fate as Sonnier. After witnessing these executions, Sister Helen realized that this lethal ritual would remain unchallenged unless its secrecy was stripped away, and so she sat down and wrote a book, *Dead Man Walking: An Eyewitness Account of the Death Penalty in the United States*. That book ignited a national debate on capital punishment and spawned an Academy Award winning movie, a play, and an opera. Sister Helen's second book, *The Death of Innocents: An Eyewitness Account of Wrongful Executions*, was published in 2004; and her third book, *River of Fire: My Spiritual Journey*, in August, 2019. She is currently collaborating on a graphic retelling of *Dead Man Walking*, to be published by Random House.

Lori Hannasch - Director of Pastoral Care at St. John Neumann Church in Eagan, MN. Along with being the Core Team Leader for SJN's upcoming Healing the Whole Person retreat presented by the internationally known John Paul II Healing Center this November, she has also completed the JPIIHC "I AM" Prayer - Ministry Training. This healing prayer method instructs individuals on how to seek and pray for the Inspiration of the Holy Spirit while Abiding in constant communion with the Lord and sensing the Movement of the Spirit to bring about deep healing.



Jay Grossman - formerly incarcerated person who utilized his time well. While incarcerated he earned his bachelor's degree and worked with the incarcerated population to enrich their lives. He utilized his spiritual gifts by teaching Adult Basic Education, facilitating psycho-educational courses in a behavioral health program, and mentoring men as a graduate of Prison Fellowship Academy. After initially working with a national manufacturer and volunteering with mental health and chemical dependency organizations upon release, he now works as the Men's Residence Director with Team Renewed helping men with housing, employment, and connection to a new community.



Rick Indriadson - I'm a husband, Father and Christ follower. I've been a changed man since 2009 I grew up I St. Paul. My mom passed away when I was 9 and dad left home when I was 5. Sister tried to raise me, and I was in and out of lock up as a juvenile and prison. Turned my life around and now I landed a job in Hennepin County corrections.



Nate Waldron is a dad, author, speaker, and scientist. But most of all he is a redeemed child of God. At age 27, Nate graduated from the University of Minnesota with a PhD in Pharmacology and at age 28 he was arrested and spent the next 6 years in prison. It was in that valley that Nate discovered God's love for him and wrote the book 'Shameless'. He now has a passion for people to experience God's love for themselves and break free from the shame of their pasts. Nate also loves to play soccer, write, and spend time with friends in his free time and currently lives in Minnesota.



Fr Jim Livingston, Church of St Paul, Ham Lake - I asked Jesus to save me when I was 25 years old. That was when I began to repent and believe as a way of life. I began to seek a life of prayer and integrity and my life began to change. That was when I became an intentional disciple of Jesus Christ as a practicing Catholic. I was ordained to the priesthood in 1990 at the age of 32. Up until 2016, I had been serving in parish ministry and hospital ministry roughly 13 years each. I've had a lot of experience in various kinds of retreat ministries and I've been shaped by both Carmelite and charismatic spirituality.



Steve Hawkins has spent his professional career in sales and marketing developing an international organization serving major North American corporations. Apart from his professional career, he has helped foster Friends of Dorothy Day providing food and friendship nightly to residents rebuilding their lives at Catholic Charities Higher Ground shelter in St Paul. And he has helped organize a nationwide pen pal program serving brothers and sisters behind bars. In 2010, Steve dedicated his life to serving the poor and the sick as a member of the Order of St John of Jerusalem of Rhodes and of Malta.
